HURRICANE ASSISTANCE NEEDED FOR THE GREYHOUNDS

I twould be hard for anyone not to be aware of the hurricanes that have just recently slammed into Florida, and the devastation that has resulted. However, many of you may not be aware of just how personally these events impact AAG. We had mentioned that most of our greyhounds come through Greyhound Pets of America, Greater Orlando. When Lynda and I are in Orlando, we volunteer with this group, and we have made many good friends among the dedicated people in this organization.

The facility, located north of Orlando consists of 3 buildings: the main office, a store, kennels with attached male/female turnout pens, and fenced in yards. The kennel facility (a converted truck garage) housed 44 dogs in kennels, and 8 more in "suites". When GPA/GO leased this property, none of the buildings were inhabitable in their

present shape, but had 'potential.' With no money to hire workers, it took various committed volunteers to

transform, over weeks and in some cases months, the diverse buildings. In the end, it was the former truck garage, an ugly duckling if ever there was one, that was transformed into a beautiful swan, or in this case, a first rate kennel. What had been only a dream for such a long time, had actually become a reality and the cause of much celebration.

Hurricanes in central Florida are a rare occurrence, but

GPA/GO had an evacuation plan, just in case. When hurricane Charlie ripped through the Orlando area, it did limited damage to

their facilities. It tore off the office sign and both front and back canopies, and the flagpole was bent to the ground. There was also some damage to the turn-out pens, but all of the dogs had already been moved into the temporary care of GPA/GO volunteers, all of whom were also bracing for the impact of this hurricane.

By the following week, repairs done, the dogs had been able to return.

The arrival of another hurricane, Frances, only 3 weeks later, is unprecedented. It has also been devastating. **The kennel is a total loss, and likely beyond repair**. The roof was torn off, the interior of the building and its contents soaked with the torrential rains, and left in ruins. Dog food, appliances, phones, crates, computer, etc, destroyed. The attached photo's, taken by GPA/GO volunteer Danny Vanzura, give you a ser

Once again, all the dogs had to be evacuated, into volunteer's homes. This time, over NINETY greyhounds made it into foster care, thanks to the greyt work of Joan Harris and Pat Jefts, who organized the kennel exodus. This in itself was no easy task, as due to the anticipated severity of this hurricane, many past volunteers had decided to evacuate themselves. Thankfully none of the greyhounds (or people) were injured.

Now there is no facility to return the dogs back to. There is the possibility that a temporary, empty kennel may be available at the Sanford/Orlando track, but it will require a lot of work, and money to make it usable. Time is of the essence in making a kennel available, as additional

greyhounds need to be taken into the adoption program on an almost daily basis, when their racing careers end.

To complicate things (and costs) even more, in the midst of hurricane Frances, one of the dogs slated to come to us was rushed to the emergency clinic and as the hurricane raged, underwent emergency surgery at a cost of \$2,500 (U.S.) Fortunately, the recovery is going well, according to the latest report from the foster home.

How can you help? Money... this newsletter goes out to over 450 homes. If everyone that receives it, sends us a cheque (payable to Adopt-A-Greyhound) for \$10, that would be \$4,500. Send us \$5 if that is all you can afford, or what you can, if you can afford more. We (AAG) are non-profit, but not a registered charity, so we cannot issue tax receipts. We do however have an emergency fund,

and our intent is to match every dollar donated, up to

\$5,000. If you send us \$10, we will send GPA/GO \$20. AAG has both a Canadian and American dollars bank account, so we can handle either currency and easily exchange funds back and forth. Remember, we also accept Visa and MasterCard (but banks do take 3%), if that is easier. We are not however, set up for bank transfers or Pay Pal.

To our friends and adopters in the United States, (70 of our newsletters go to you), GPA/GO is 501c3 registered, and if you require a tax receipt, make your donation by check or money order, send it to us, payable to "Greyhound Pets of America/Greater Orlando" and we will get them to issue a tax receipt directly to you.


